Benefits of Venue

- Experienced and proven organizing committee, operations crew and race staff
- Ski Roundtop management dedicated to and experienced with providing exceptional snow surface and support for junior racing events
- Competition Center at bottom of Exhibition provides deck area for spectators as well as covered areas for coaches and race staff
- Since 2019, a dedicated Race Tent for Derby racers, coaches and their families has been utilized
- Live Timing on display in common area of Comp Center
- Comp Center includes PA system providing clear sound capabilities over entire race course and spectator area
- PA system and scoreboard announce racers and stats in real time; visible to spectators, coaches and racers at bottom of finish line

- Ongoing experienced RS, Timing Crew and COR with race experience

Timing

- Timing area in Competition Center provides an exceptional view of course
- Two TC2 and TC1 Timing Chiefs with over 30 years of combined timing experience
- Additional RA certifications and experience
- Race documentation completed as often as possible prior to the end of each run
- World Cup points calculated immediately after each run
- New timing wires and junction boxes tested weekly during the season and updated as needed
- New finish wires run up the hill accommodate a more U12 appropriate course length
- Living Timing displayed in Comp Center
- Recent timing technology upgrades support an efficiently run race

Officials and Coaches

- Large coaching staff with significant experience producing, coaching and officiating races
- Majority of coaches have Level 200 certifications and a number of Referee Certifications
- Large coaching staff prepared to assist with course maintenance and venue preparation

Fee

- Two-day event to support lower fees for racers

Requirements

• A minimum of 80 racers is required for the event to work financially, or SRRC reserves a 20% fee increase to cover increasing costs
